Classes for all including TREC newbies!

10:10 Training competition consists of 3 phases.

- 1. Control of Paces.** Up to 100m in length. Horse required to canter as slowly as possible along a measured track - then walk back as fast as possible along the same distance. A break of pace/stepping out results in zero for that pace.
- 2. Obstacles.** 10 obstacles with a maximum of 10 points each.
- 3. Orienteering.** Competitors will have 10 minutes in the map room to copy a route from a master map onto a provided map. 10 things to find

★ **Class 1 OPEN individual**

Phase 1. MA / Control of paces. Horse required to canter as slowly as possible along a measured track then walk as fast as possible along the same distance. Points given on a sliding scale. A break of pace / stepping out of the corridor results in a zero score for that pace.

Phase 2. PTV / Obstacles. 10 obstacles with a maximum of 10 points at each. Full details of obstacles and scoring will be available on the day.

Phase 3 POR / Orienteering. Approx 10k route Competitors will have 10 minutes in the map room to copy a route from a master map onto a provided map. They will also have 10 challenges which will consist of map based questions [may include grid references] to answer in the map room and en route plus markers / tickets to be found en route. Different map scales may be used. An optimum speed will be given for the whole route [to be advised on day] Please note - for all classes there is roadwork section. There are gates on the route which will need to be opened and closed.

★ **Class 2 OPEN pairs**

Phase 1. MA / Control of paces. Horse required to canter as slowly as possible along a measured track then walk as fast as possible along the same distance. Points given on a sliding scale. A break of pace / stepping out of the corridor results in a zero score for that pace.

Phase 2. PTV / Obstacles. 10 obstacles with a maximum of 10 points at each. Full details of obstacles and scoring will be available on the day.

Phase 3 POR / Orienteering. Approx 10k route Competitors will have 10 minutes in the map room to copy a route from a master map onto a provided map. They will also have 10 challenges which will consist of map based questions [may include grid references] to answer in the map room and en route plus markers / tickets to be found en route. Different map scales may be used. An optimum speed will be given for the whole route [to be advised on day] Please note - for all classes there is roadwork section. There are gates on the route which will need to be opened and closed.

★ **Class 3. NOVICE individual** Combination of horse and rider not have come 1st, 2nd or 3rd at an affiliated Level 1 competition or higher.

Phase 1. MA / Control of paces. Horse required to canter as slowly as possible along a measured track then walk as fast as possible along the same distance. Points given on a sliding scale. A break of pace / stepping out of the corridor results in a zero score for that pace.

Phase 2. PTV / Obstacles. 10 obstacles with a maximum of 10 points at each. Full details of obstacles and scoring will be available on the day.

Phase 3 POR / Orienteering. Approx 10k route. Competitors will have 10 minutes in the map room to copy their route from a master map onto a provided map. Advice on map reading will be available. There may also be markers / tickets to be found enroute. An optimum speed will be given for the whole route [to be advised on day] (Option to take 10 penalties and have pre drawn map provided rather than copy it in the map room)

★ **Class 4. NOVICE pairs** At least one of the pair - combination of horse and rider not to have come 1st, 2nd or 3rd at an affiliated Level 1 competition or higher. Pairs ride Phases 1 & 2 individually.

Phase 1. MA / Control of paces. Horse required to canter as slowly as possible along a measured track then walk as fast as possible along the same distance. Points given on a sliding scale. A break of pace / stepping out of the corridor results in a zero score for that pace.

Phase 2. PTV / Obstacles. 10 obstacles with a maximum of 10 points at each. Full details of obstacles and scoring will be available on the day.

Phase 3 POR / Orienteering. Approx 10k route. Competitors will have 10 minutes in the map room to copy their route from a master map onto a provided map. Advice on map reading will be available.

There may also be markers / tickets to be found enroute. An optimum speed will be given for the whole route [to be advised on day] (Option to take 10 penalties and have pre drawn map provided rather than copy it in the map room)

★ **Class 5 JUNIOR pairs** Both pairs under 14 years of age. An adult will be required to accompany them on the Orienteering phase (On foot or bike). Pairs ride Phases 1 & 2 individually.

Phase 1. MA / Control of paces. Pony required to **TROT** as slowly as possible along a measured track then walk as fast as possible along the same distance. Points given on a sliding scale. A break of pace / stepping out of the corridor results in a zero score for that pace.

Phase 2. PTV / Obstacles. 10 obstacles with a maximum of 10 points at each. Full details of obstacles and scoring will be available on the day.

Phase 3 POR / Orienteering. A short 2k route. Competitors will be given a copy of their map to follow. There will be treasure to find along the route.

★ **Class 6 JUNIOR individual** Rider must be under 14 years of age. An adult will be required to accompany them on the Orienteering phase (On foot or bike).

Phase 1. MA / Control of paces. Pony required to **TROT** as slowly as possible along a measured track then walk as fast as possible along the same distance. Points given on a sliding scale. A break of pace / stepping out of the corridor results in a zero score for that pace.

Phase 2. PTV / Obstacles. 10 obstacles with a maximum of 10 points at each. Full details of obstacles and scoring will be available on the day.

Phase 3 POR / Orienteering. A short 2k route. Competitors will be given a copy of their map to follow. There will be treasure to find along the route.

Riders who are under the age of 14 must ride in one of the pairs classes, with a pair who is over 18 on the day of the competition

Parents/guardians of competitors under the age of 18 on the day of the competition will be required to complete a Parental Consent Form

Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the organiser and may be subject to a surcharge. Please enter early as places will be limited. In the event the competition is full, a waiting list will be kept.

Equine Flu Requirements: **TREC GB requires that all equines must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza** and that organisers of any events involving equines insist that vaccinations are up to date (12-month cycle) and check passports before horses are unloaded. Full details of the TREC GB Equine Flu Vaccination requirements are available on the website (<https://trecgb.com/trec-gb-equine-flu-requirements/>)

Your horse can be registered on the TREC GB central register by sending a copy of the full vaccination record and horse registration details from the passport to admin@trecgb.com . Alternatively, your horse will be registered by the Entries Secretary for this event, please include a copy of the vaccination certificate and horse registration details when sending your completed entry in.

All competitors (including TREC GB Blue Members) must have 3rd Party Public Liability Insurance cover, or be members of a TREC GB Affiliated club (if they do NOT have 3rd Party Public Liability Insurance cover elsewhere) or be RED members of TREC GB itself.

All entries must be in writing and accompanied by the correct entry fee. All classes are subject to sufficient entries and the organisers reserve the right to cancel or amalgamate classes, as necessary. Entries are on a strictly first come basis, enter early to avoid disappointment.

Entry closing dates and refunds/withdrawals

Entries close on 10th September 2024 or before, if full. Withdrawals up to this date will receive a full refund. Any refunds for withdrawals after the closing date will be entirely at the discretion of the organiser.

Start times and directions

These will be available on www.treciom.com by the Thursday before the event.

Tack / Dress / Equipment

Tack – any safe well-fitting tack Any safe/comfortable clothing with suitable safe footwear

Compulsory equipment

Riders must wear a hat approved to current standards (see below)

- Hi viz clothing – minimum of stripes on rider’s torso, but more is recommended
- Horse ID attached to the horse with the rider’s details and the emergency phone number [Luggage tags work well for ID]
- Headcollar & Rope if using a martingale
- Pens
- Medical Armband (Rider ID worn on rider with the emergency phone numbers)
- Hoof pick

Recommended additional equipment

- Map case and fluorescent marking pens , gel pens.
- Compass
- Waterproofs
- First Aid Kit
- Headcollar & Rope if NOT using a martingale
- Whistle

Classes 5-6 (Junior classes) Hi Viz clothing is the only compulsory equipment required

Helpers

All TREC competitions rely on the support of volunteer judges and helpers. Can you or anyone coming with you lend a hand?

Competitors can also help us with setting up, clearing equipment away, collecting scores etc. No judging experience necessary – we are grateful for all offers of help and you will learn lots from the inside! Even a couple of hours of help can make a difference and there are lots of jobs suitable for non-horsey mums/dads/partners. We provide all judges with free refreshments

Health and Safety

The event manager/organiser will take all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the officials and stewards on the day.

Trained First Aiders will be present at the event and should be summoned through an official in the event of an accident. The event manager/organiser may provide contact telephone numbers for emergency veterinary and farriery services.

Competitors are asked to safeguard valuable tack and possessions. Young children must be supervised at all times. Neither the event manager/organiser nor the land/course owners can accept responsibility for loss or injury to persons or animals howsoever caused.

What is TREC?

TREC is a fun riding event usually comprising three phases. The competition involves the skills and situations a rider might encounter on a hack, including map reading (using Ordnance Survey maps usually 1:25 000 scale)

Competition Rules

All competitors must comply with the TREC GB Rules as per the 6th edition TREC GB rulebook (plus subsequent amendments), which can be found at <https://trecgb.com/rules/>

In addition, pay particular attention to the following:

- 1) Horses must be a minimum of four years old to compete at Level 1, 2 and 2A and five years old to compete at levels 3 and 4 (i.e. for levels 1, 2 and 2A, a horse born in 2019 may compete in 2023). Mares more than four months pregnant may not compete.
- 2) The welfare of horses competing in British TREC competitions is paramount. No horse may compete if it is unsound or unfit to carry the rider for any reason. Any rider who continues on a horse that they know to be unsound or that has been definitively stopped by the veterinary surgeon or designated competent official on fitness and/ or welfare grounds will be eliminated from the competition.

3) Riders under the age of fourteen on day of competition may only compete in Pairs classes and must be accompanied by a rider of **18 years or older**. Pairs ride together for POR and separately for the MA and PTV. Parents/guardians of competitors under the age of 18 on the day of the competition will be required to complete a Parental Consent Form (available on the TREC GB website:
<https://trecgb.com/parental-consent-form/>

4) All competitors (including TREC GB Blue Members) must have 3rd Party Public Liability Insurance cover, or be members of a TREC GB Affiliated club (if they do NOT have 3rd Party Public Liability Insurance cover elsewhere) or be RED members of TREC GB itself.

5) Clearly visible coloured tail wraps/ribbons should be worn to advise other riders of a potential hazard – Red = kicker, Green = young/inexperienced horse, Blue = stallion. If the horse/pony is a stallion then stallion discs must also be worn on both sides of the bridle.

It is your responsibility to familiarise yourself with the basic rules. The TREC GB Rulebook (7th edition issued in 2024 and the changes to it) can be found on the TREC GB website, <https://trecgb.com/rules/>

Safety Helmet Standards

A safety helmet conforming to one of the following standards must be worn, with the chinstrap fastened, at all times when mounted.

The approved standards for British TREC are

- PAS 015 (2011) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark
- VG1 01.040 (2014-12) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark
- SEI ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards), providing it has an SEI mark
- SNELL E2016 (or later), providing it has a SNELL label and number
- AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards), providing it has an SAI Global mark
- EN 1384 : 2023 (provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC mark

Any hat used must conform to one or more of these standards.

Hat cameras

A camera may not be worn on the hat when mounted.

Body protectors

The approved standard for body protectors for British TREC is
BETA Level 3 turquoise/ blue 2018 label

Body Protectors will NOT be required for this competition as we have no fixed obstacles.

It is recommended that body protectors are replaced every 3-5 years, even if they are apparently undamaged.
